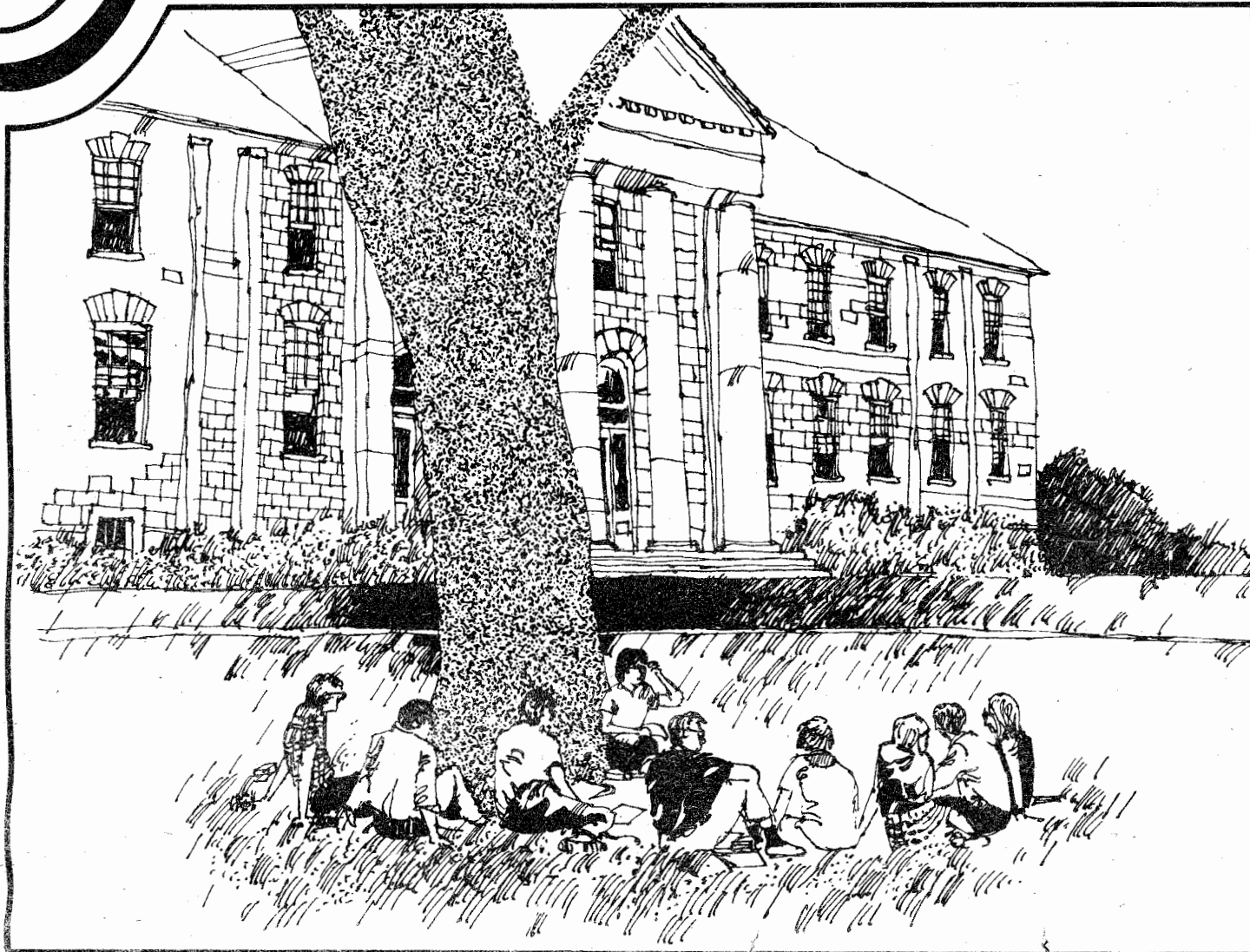

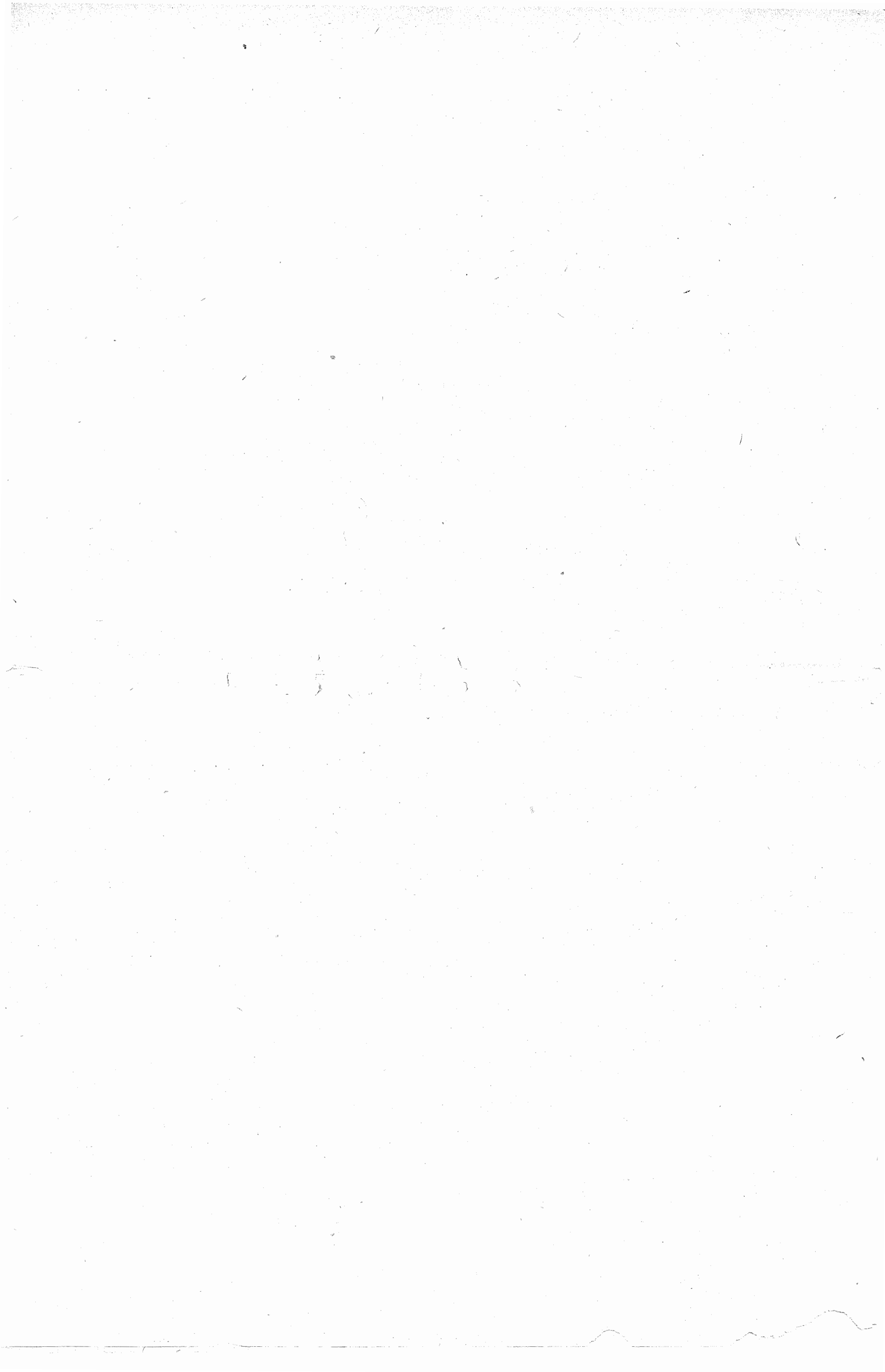

Registration Procedures

I. Registration Materials - You should receive the following materials:

A. Set of IBM Cards

1. Registration Authorization Card - Arrange your class time schedule on this card. You do not need to use the mark-sense pencil for this card. THIS CARD MUST BE TURNED IN.
2. Student Supplemental Health Insurance Coverage Card - Supplemental Health coverage may be optionally elected. Cost for such coverage is \$36.75 per semester. *IF YOU ELECT TO RECEIVE COVERAGE, clip the I.D. form from the front of this card for use during the period of coverage. Retaining this card automatically gives you coverage. IF YOU DO NOT WANT COVERAGE, read the waiver instruction on the card, sign the appropriate waiver area on the back of the card and turn in the card according to your registration instructions. Approved doctoral candidates must take positive action to secure insurance by contacting the Wardenburg Student Health Center or the designated insurance company directly.
3. Course Request Cards - Complete and return one card for each course. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** A separate card IS NOT needed for labs or recitations since there is space provided on the card. USE THE MARK-SENSE PENCIL FOR THESE CARDS.

II. Instructions and Examples for Completing Registration Authorization Cards and Course Request Card - After consulting an academic adviser or reading the advising instructions and reviewing school/college requirements:

A. Student prepares tentative class schedule.

1. Student fills in his proposed schedule on the Registration Authorization Card (see sample below).
2. Using one line for each course desired, enter the department number, department abbreviation, course number, and desired section number for the lecture, laboratory, and recitation (if any) and their scheduled meeting times.
3. Course Credit Hour - Print the number of credit hours you will receive for each course. If you are taking a course for no credit, print NC in the course credit hour space.
4. It is very important that the department number be correct and legible. This number is found in the Schedule of Courses, left of the department abbreviation.
5. **IMPORTANT:** Check to be sure there are no conflicts in class meeting times. This check may be done by completing the time schedule portion of the card.

III. Mark-Sensing Request Cards - When marking bubbles, correctly copy your lecture, lab, and recitation numbers, including all zeros. Thus, Lecture 1 would be 01000000.

1. Enter your student number (found on your Registration Authorization Card) in the left-hand section of each course request card.
2. Mark-sense one course request card for each course listed on your Schedule Card. You must use the special mark-sense pencil provided. (See illustration below of sample course request cards as marked from schedule card.)
3. Be especially careful to fill in the correct department number.
4. Mark all section numbers in the lecture column unless preceded by R (recit) or L (lab). If a course does not have a lab or recitation, leave those sections blank on the course request cards.
5. If the course you select is listed in the credit hour column of the Schedule of Courses as VAR (Variable Credit) or if you wish to take the course for no credit, you MUST indicate the number of credit hours you wish to receive for it by marking the appropriate bubble in the Credit column located on the right-hand side of the course request card.

IV. Final Check Before Turning In

1. Check the following:
 1. Insure that a course request cards has been prepared for each of your selected courses.
 2. Check course request cards for correct marking.
 3. Insure that there are no conflicts in the class meeting times of your selected courses.

Students are advised to make tentative plans for their schedules on the model below.

V. Controlled Enrollment

For courses so designated in the Schedule of Courses with an 800 series section number and the statement, "Secure a Departmental Controlled Enrollment Card," the student must go to the office of the department offering the course to obtain a Controlled Enrollment Card. The student must deposit this card instead of the regular course request card in order to enroll in that course. A request for a course on a regular course request card is not acceptable and the student WILL NOT be placed into the course.

VI. Students registering for courses with sections numbered 900 or above (Independent Study, Thesis, Candidate for Degree, etc.) MUST obtain an Independent Study/Thesis Approval Form from the department offering the course. This form must be completed and deposited with the student's other course request cards. A regular course request card will not be accepted at the Final Registration Check Point.

VII. Inter-Campus Registration Procedures

Option 1 - Boulder campus students who wish to take course work on another campus can register on that campus independent of their home campus registration. However, they must apply to that campus and attend their registration process.

Option 2 - Boulder campus students who are unable to obtain courses required for their degree programs on the Boulder campus may exercise the Concurrent Enrollment option. Students enrolled for a minimum of one course on the Boulder campus will be allowed to register for up to 2 courses or 6 hours, whichever is greater on another campus provided the coursework is required for their degree programs and they have their dean's permission. Boulder students exercising this option will pay tuition for their total credit hours on the Boulder campus only, at Boulder campus rates. Concurrent Registration forms and instructions are available from the Class Scheduling Section of the Office of the University Registrar, Regent Hall 125.

OPTIONAL PASS/FAIL ENROLLMENT

1. Before enrolling in courses on the pass/fail option, students should consult their school and college requirements and restrictions concerning pass/fail enrollment to insure an approved registration. Students may obtain pass/fail cards from either the Registration Phase III Final Check Clerks or at the Office of the University Registrar. Completed pass/fail cards must be turned in at the Office of the University Registrar prior to 4:45 p.m. on Thursday, September 20. Students will be given a validated receipt upon submission of the pass/fail card. In those cases where the Office of the University Registrar does not indicate that the student has enrolled for pass/fail and the student contends that he did enroll for pass/fail, it is the student's responsibility to support his claim by providing the student pass/fail receipt form. After Thursday, September 20, it will not be possible for a student to enroll for pass/fail.
2. The record of pass/fail registration is maintained by the Office of the University Registrar.
3. Academic deans and faculty will not be aware of specific pass/fail registrations. For example, all students who are registered on a pass/fail basis appear on the regular class rosters and a normal letter grade is assigned on the final grade roster by the professor. When grades are received in the Records Office, those registrations which require a pass/fail designation are automatically converted by the grade application system. Grades of D and above convert to a grade of P. Grades of F would equal a letter grade of F.
4. Only 6 hours of course work may be pass/fail in a given semester.

DROP/ADD STANDARD PROCEDURE

1. Students will be allowed to drop and add through Thursday, September 20, with no signatures required on the Drop/Add form.
2. After this date, the instructor must sign Drops and Adds. The dean's signature is not required.
3. After the tenth week (Friday, November 9, 1979), courses may not be dropped and added unless there are circumstances clearly beyond the student's control (accident, illness, etc.); in addition to the instructor's certification (as in 2 above), the student's dean must approve all Drops and Adds.
4. No tuition and fee adjustment will be made on courses dropped after Thursday, September 20, 1979. Courses dropped after this date will appear with a "W".
5. Validated receipts are available to all students who deposit Drop/Add Cards at the Office of the University Registrar, Regent 125. This receipt is required to substantiate claims that Drop/Add were submitted to the Office of the University Registrar.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

1. Payment of the Registration or Confirmation Deposit and the submission of registration materials results in the processing of your registration, and therefore obligates you to pay the full amount of tuition and fees for the Fall Semester 1979.
 2. If, subsequent to registration and prior to the beginning of classes, you decide that you will not attend the University of Colorado at Boulder, you MUST withdraw in the Office of the University Bursar at the Tuition and Fee desk. After classes begin, you must withdraw at the Dean's office of your school or college and deposit the form at the Tuition and Fee section in the Office of the University Bursar, Regent 102.
- IMPORTANT: FAILURE TO WITHDRAW MAKES YOU LIABLE FOR THE FULL AMOUNT OF TUITION AND FEES ASSESSED FOR THE FALL SEMESTER OF 1979 (IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE BOARD OF REGENTS' RULING ON AUGUST 18, 1971).**
3. In addition, failure to properly withdraw will result in a failing grade being reported for every course you requested and were sectioned into for the Fall Semester 1979. PLEASE REFER TO REFUND AND WITHDRAWAL CHARGES (SEE BELOW FOR TUITION REFUNDS).
 4. Undergraduate students who fail to pick up their class schedules by 4:30 p.m., Thursday, September 20, will automatically be withdrawn from school.

LOST SCHEDULE - VALIDATION STICKER POLICIES

1. Students who fail to obtain a tuition validation sticker by Thursday, September 20, 1979, will be charged \$2.00 for a validation sticker issued beyond that date.
2. Students requesting copies of their student schedules, for any reason, will be charged \$1.00 per copy.

REFUNDS AND WITHDRAWAL CHARGES

No change of program or withdrawal is valid without the written consent of the Dean of the college or school in which the student is registered. If a student withdraws from the Boulder Campus, adjustments or refunds of the total tuition and fees are made as follows:

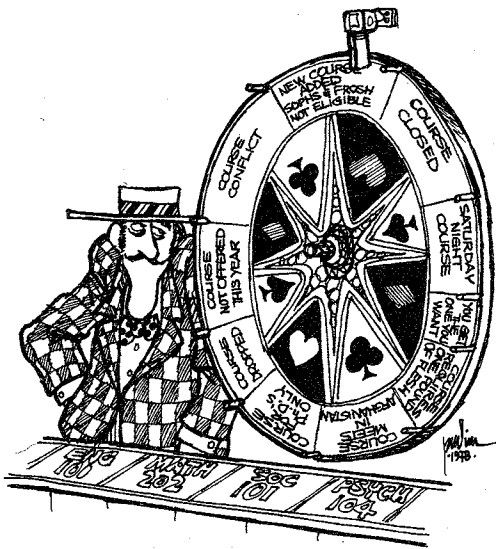

Tuition and Fees

THE BOARD OF REGENTS RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE TUITION AND FEES AT ANY TIME. TUITION AND FEES FOR 1979-80 WERE NOT AVAILABLE AT PRESS TIME; HOWEVER, AN INCREASE IS ANTICIPATED. TUITION AND FEES FOR 1978-79 WERE:

*OVER 18 - A SURCHARGE OF 1/15 of the full-time rate will be assessed for each credit hour per semester in excess of 18 credit hours. For residents, the surcharge will be \$22.00; for nonresidents, the surcharge will be \$89.00.

- Students will be assessed tuition for the number of hours they have as of September 20, 1979.
- Students certified by the Graduate School as approved Candidates for Doctoral Degrees will pay resident tuition for 3 credit hours.
- Nonresident students enrolled as "Candidate for Degree" only to take a comprehensive examination for a master's degree will pay resident tuition for 3 credit hours.
- Nonresident graduate and nonresident special students enrolled for 3 hours or less will pay \$266.00 plus appropriate fees.
- Students taking 6 hours or less have the option of waiving the student health fee of \$44.90.
- There will be optional medical coverage available from Lone Star Life Insurance Company at a cost of \$36.75 per semester. Students must pay the Student Health Fee (\$44.90) in order to have the Medical Insurance.
- Students enrolled for one course of four credit hours or less must pay a minimum student fee of \$21.15 and may elect to pay either the Student Health Fee or full student fees.
- Tuition for a NO CREDIT course is the same as a course taken for credit.
- Tuition for a zero (0) credit hour course is charged at the rate of a one credit hour class.
- No refund is given on courses dropped after September 20, 1979.

Please be sure to read your optional health insurance information as there have been several changes.

NOTICE TO STUDENTS

Periodically, but not less than annually, the University of Colorado informs students of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. This Act, with which the institution intends to comply fully, was designated to protect the privacy of education records, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Students also have the right to file complaints with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA) concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the Act.

Local policy explains in detail the procedures to be used by the institution for compliance with the provisions of the Act. Copies of the policy can be found in the library on each of the campuses of the University of Colorado.

A Directory of Records which lists all education records maintained on students by this institution may be found in the Office of the Chancellor on each campus.

The following items of student information have been designated by the University of Colorado as public or "Directory Information." Such information may be disclosed by the institution for any purpose, at its discretion.

- Name, address, telephone number, dates of attendance, registration status, class, major field of study, awards, honors, degree(s) conferred, past and present participation in officially recognized sports and activities, physical factors (height, weight) of athletes, date and place of birth.

Currently enrolled students may withhold disclosure of directory information under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. To withhold disclosure, written notification must be received each term in the Office of the University Registrar on the appropriate campus prior to the 11th day of classes. Forms requesting the withholding of "Directory Information" are available in the Offices of the University Registrars.

The University of Colorado assumes that failure on the part of any student to specifically request the withholding of "Directory Information" indicates individual approval for disclosure.

Questions concerning the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act may be referred to the Office of the University Registrar on the Boulder campus, and to the Office of Admissions and Records on the other campuses.

AREA REQUIREMENTS

THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES REQUIRES THAT EACH OF ITS STUDENTS COMPLETE FOUR SEMESTERS OF WORK IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING AREAS: HUMANITIES, NATURAL SCIENCES, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES. TO SATISFY ONE-HALF OF ANY OF THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS THE STUDENT MUST COMPLETE A 2-SEMESTER COMBINATION OF COURSES IN A SINGLE DEPARTMENT. THE STUDENT MAY CHOOSE A SECOND DEPARTMENT IN WHICH TO COMPLETE THE SECOND HALF OF THE REQUIREMENT OR CONTINUE TO TAKE COURSES IN THE DEPARTMENT IN WHICH HE ORIGINALLY ENROLLED.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE - STUDENTS MUST DEMONSTRATE A THIRD-SEMESTER PROFICIENCY IN A SINGLE FOREIGN LANGUAGE. STUDENTS WHO HAVE COMPLETED A THIRD-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL COURSE IN A FOREIGN LANGUAGE ARE EXEMPT FROM FURTHER FOREIGN LANGUAGE STUDY EXCEPT WHERE SUCH STUDY IS REQUIRED BY SPECIFIC MAJOR REQUIREMENTS.

GENERAL INFORMATION

THE ACADEMIC POLICIES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ARE PRINTED IN THE 1979-80 UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO, BOULDER, CATALOG. ALL STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING AND FOLLOWING THE PROVISIONS SET FORTH IN THE CATALOG. ANY QUESTIONS CONCERNING THOSE PROVISIONS ARE TO BE DIRECTED TO THE COLLEGE OFFICE. THE COLLEGE CANNOT ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR PROBLEMS RESULTING FROM A STUDENT'S FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE POLICIES STATED IN THE CATALOG OR FROM MISADVICE GIVEN BY SOMEONE OTHER THAN A STAFF MEMBER OF THE COLLEGE. SIMILARLY, STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL DEADLINES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS IN THIS SCHEDULE.

Administrative Drops - Business faculty may drop students for nonattendance. Students are responsible for checking with their instructors concerning attendance policies.

Area of Emphasis - Typically, after taking several of the core courses, students select an area from the 15 offered. Then, having found their own interest, students take the 12 hours required for their area. Many students use their business and nonbusiness electives to complete requirements for two areas.

Business Electives - Nine hours needed. These are any courses taught by the College of Business and Administration in addition to those required in either the business "core" or the "area of emphasis."

Course Eligibility - Upper division standing is required for admission to business courses numbered 300 to 399 and 400 to 499.

Deadline - THE STUDENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR BEING AWARE OF AND OBSERVING ALL UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE OF BUSINESS DEADLINES.

Drop/Add - for business classes is by petition only. Nonbusiness students will not be sectioned into business classes due to space limitations. During the first week of class, business students and nonbusiness students REQUIRED TO TAKE A BUSINESS CLASS FOR GRADUATION may petition to add. All class assignments will be on a space available basis. Nonbusiness departments requiring a business class for graduation are asked to send a list of their students, their class standing, and the class they are asked to take to the College of Business, Office of Undergraduate Studies, prior to registration. Petitions not picked up by the end of the first week of class will become void.

Information for Graduating Seniors - All graduating seniors must contact the Office of Undergraduate Studies for a complete academic evaluation prior to registering for their last term on campus.

To receive a B.S. degree in business, the student must have achieved a grade point average of 2.0 for all work attempted after admission to the University of Colorado, a 2.0 average for all Business courses attempted at the University, and a 2.0 average in the four required area-of-emphasis courses.

Intrauniversity Transfer - Students who wish to transfer to business from another college or school of the University must formally apply at the dean's office (Room 230). A minimum University of Colorado grade-point average is established by the College of Business and is required for consideration. A limited number of students are admitted to the college each term on IUT and when the quota is filled, applications will not be accepted until the next term.

Students desiring admission to official combined programs must apply and be accepted by the College of Business. Minimum grade-point averages are also established for these jointly enrolled students. Approval of deans of both colleges is required.

A separate application must be filed for each term.

Mathematics - May use any of the following options: #1 - Math 107 and 108; #2 - Math 110 and 130; #3 - Math 130 or A Math 131 (use of one of these increases required non-business electives by one hour). Math 108 or 135 alone will not meet the math requirement. A maximum of 9 hours of math below the level of analytical geometry and calculus is acceptable.

Natural Science - chemistry, physics, biology, astronomy, physical geography, physical anthropology, geology, earth science, physical science.

Nonbusiness Electives - Nonrequired courses taken outside the College of Business and Administration selected according to the student's own interest (excluding activity P.E., remedial courses, and lower-division ROTC). Nine hours must be upper division (numbered in 300s or 400s).

Nonclassroom Sources of Credit (e.g., Independent Study, Certain Experimental Studies) - A maximum of 6 hours of nonclassroom sources of credit will be counted toward the B.S. degree in business with not more than 3 hours of such credit per semester. A description of the course and appropriate approvals must be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Studies prior to registering for any independent study course. Independent study courses in business are intended for business seniors.

Pass/Fail - A maximum of 16 hours of P/F work may be credited toward a business degree. P/F courses may not be used to satisfy core requirements or area of emphasis requirements. Any nonbusiness course requirements (Math, Econ, etc) may be taken P/F. Transfer students may take one hour P/F for every 8 semester hours attempted at this University. **PASS/FAIL DETERMINATION MUST BE MADE WITHIN UNIVERSITY DEADLINES AND IS IRREVERSIBLE.**

Physical Education - P. E., recreation, and dance activity courses may not be counted toward a B.S. degree in business, but a maximum of 6 hours of theory (non-activity) courses may be applied to nonbusiness electives.

Prerequisites - Students registering for courses without having completed appropriate prerequisites or who do not have the appropriate class standing may be administratively dropped from business classes. Business majors are defined as students officially enrolled in the College of Business and Administration.

Repeating Courses - Repetition of work either at the University of Colorado and/or elsewhere, or below college-level work, is not acceptable toward a B.S. degree in business. Grades of D earned at this institution count toward graduation and courses need not be repeated. The College of Business and Administration does not remove F's or change grades if a course is repeated. All work attempted will appear on permanent records.

ROTC - Only 12 hours of 300 and 400 level ROTC courses may be counted, providing the student is enrolled in the ROTC program and completes it.

Statement of Academic Standards - Students are held to basic standards of performance established for their classes with respect to attendance, active participation in course work, promptness in completion of assignments, correct English usage both in writing and in speech, accuracy in calculations, and general quality of scholastic workmanship.

In general, examinations are required in all courses and for all students including seniors.

To be in good standing, students must have an overall grade-point average of not less than 2.0 (C = 2.0) for all course work attempted and a 2.0 for all business courses attempted. This applies to work taken at all University campuses. Physical Education activity courses and remedial course work are not included in the overall average.

When semester grades become available, students below the acceptable standard will be notified of (1) probationary status or (2) suspension. College rules governing probation and suspension are as follows:

1. Any student whose overall grade average, or business course average, is less than a 2.0 shall be placed on probation immediately. A student may be removed from probation when the overall average and the business average have been raised to 2.0.
2. A student shall remain on probation as long as the student maintains normal degree progress each semester as determined by the college and obtains no grade below a C. Such probationary status may continue a maximum of four regular semesters providing these provisions have been met. Failure to meet these provisions will result in indefinite suspension.
3. Indefinitely suspended students may attend the University of Colorado summer school in order to improve their grade average in the area of deficiency, but they may not attend any division of the University for at least two regular (fall and spring) semesters.
4. A student who has been under indefinite suspension for two semesters may apply for readmission to the College of Business and Administration. If readmitted, that readmission will be on a probationary status. After being readmitted under such probationary status, any student who fails to comply with the requirements of their probation will be subject to permanent suspension.
5. Any student who is placed on suspension more than once will be permanently suspended from the College of Business.
6. Any student earning all failing grades or no academic credit for the semester will not be permitted to register without the dean's approval.
7. Official combined degree students are required to maintain the same standard of performance as College of Business students in order to be continued in the combined business program.

Transfer Students - Transfer work from other institutions is evaluated first by the University of Colorado Office of the University Registrar, but final degree determination is made by the College of Business. Transfer credits from unaccredited institutions will not apply toward the business degree. On questions of substitution for required courses, comparisons of catalog descriptions will be made. Students are responsible for providing course descriptions. Transfer credit for business courses taken at a lower-division level is limited to only such courses as the University of Colorado at that level.

GENERAL INFORMATION - RULES

The requirements and policies of the College and the University are printed in the 1979-80 University of Colorado, Boulder catalog. Every student should become familiar with these requirements as well as with the specific requirements of his major department. Catalogs may be obtained from the office of University Registrar. Students should also refer to the section entitled "General Rules" at the front of this Schedule of Courses, which outlines the Standard Grading System, Pass/Fail, Drop/Add, and Withdrawal Procedures. In addition, each Engineering student should have a copy of the Student Survival Guide. This Survival Guide pamphlet provides important information relative to the rules of the College of Engineering and Applied Science and is available in the dean's office, EC AD 1-1.

Note:

BECAUSE OF THE REQUIRED LEAD TIME BETWEEN PUBLICATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO CATALOG, CHANGES IN UNIVERSITY AND/OR COLLEGE RULES AND POLICIES MAY OCCUR IN THE INTERIM. IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE AWARE OF REVISIONS. THIS CAN BEST BE ACCOMPLISHED BY CONSULTING WITH DEPARTMENTAL ADVISERS, CHECKING DEPARTMENTAL BULLETIN BOARDS, AND READING THE LATEST STUDENT SURVIVAL GUIDE AND THE NARRATIVE PRECEDING EACH SEMESTER'S COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING SCHEDULE OF COURSES LISTING.

FACULTY ADVISERS

Advising is available through departmental offices and the administrative offices of the College of Engineering and Applied Science, EC AD 1-1. Each student is assigned a departmental adviser and should check with the department office to verify the adviser's name. Departmental approval is required to assure that courses will apply toward the degree. All transfer students should also check with their departmental transfer credit evaluators at the time of their first registration, concerning the evaluation of their transfer credits.

GENERAL COLLEGE POLICIES

1. In the College of Engineering and Applied Science, a student must attain a cumulative average of at least 2.0 for all courses attempted and for all courses that count toward graduation requirements. The Committee on Academic Progress may require suspension, probation, warning, or mandatory adjustment of academic load and extra-curricular activities for those who fail to meet this requirement. All courses that the student transfers from other colleges and campuses of the University of Colorado are included in the compilation of the cumulative average.

- Students should enroll for a minimum of 12 hours each semester during the regular academic year, or petition for approval to take fewer hours. Those students who are employed should complete an "Employed Student Report" at the dean's office.
- Students are expected to fulfill all prerequisites. It is important to study the catalog carefully because many courses must be taken in specific sequence. Students who receive D's in prerequisite courses and wish to register for the succeeding course must petition to obtain approval of their major department, the instructor of the succeeding course, and the dean's office before attending that course.
- The College of Engineering and Applied Science will not remove F's or any other grade for any courses repeated. A student's cumulative grade point average shall include all academic courses attempted at the University of Colorado.
- Students should note the restrictions on the Pass/Fail option given in the Student Survival Guide and check with their department office for specific departmental restrictions. Pass/Fail forms require the signatures of a designated faculty member of a student's major department plus dean's approval.
- Students intending to take any course NC (non-credit) must receive written permission in advance from the dean's office. No course to be included in the 136 semester credit hours required for graduation can be taken NC.

SENIORS

Students planning to graduate in December or May should complete an Application Form prior to the third week of the semester. Forms are available at schedule pick-up or in the dean's office EC AD 1-1.

INFORMATION FOR GRADUATING SENIORS

- All graduating seniors should notify their major departments prior to their last term on campus and carefully plan their schedules with their advisers' approval so as to assure fulfillment of requirements for the degree. Tentative commencement lists will be posted on the bulletin board outside the dean's office. The name of each graduating senior should appear on this list. Each senior should verify that the name is spelled correctly and is given as it should appear on the diploma. Each individual's major should also be shown correctly. Please notify the dean's office of any errors on this list.
- All incomplete grades and correspondence course grades must be completed no later than four weeks prior to graduation. It is up to the student to contact the instructor concerning the removal of incomplete grades.
- Minimum requirements for the B.S. degree:
 - Total of 136 hours passed in a prescribed curriculum
 - A Grade point average of 2.0 for all courses attempted and for all courses that count toward graduation requirements excluding from grade averaging the letter grade P given in Pass/Fail courses. These courses may, however, count toward graduation.
 - Last 30 hours must be taken as a degree student in the College of Engineering and Applied Science.
 - Recommendation by the faculty of the student's major department and the faculty of the College of Engineering and Applied Science.

Students may check with the dean's office to verify that they will have the total number of hours and grade point average required for graduation. It is also the student's responsibility to check with the departmental adviser on fulfillment of the specific requirements of the major department.

You may select the elective courses from any department on campus. These courses include a broad spectrum of offerings from other colleges as well as the College of Environmental Design but should support your declared emphasis or specialization or double major. A minor is usually selected during the second year with faculty consultation.

DATES OF THE FOREIGN LANGUAGE EXAMINATIONS FOR DEGREE CANDIDATES

The Graduate School foreign language requirement may be satisfied by passing the Graduate School Foreign Language Test (GSFLT). The examinations are administered by the Office of Testing-Research-Evaluation (ext. 7067), and they are offered in German, French, Russian, and Spanish. Examination dates for the fall semester are available in the Office of Testing. Students wishing to take the examination must register at least one month before the testing date in the Office of Testing-Research-Evaluation. The examination fee is \$15. Information concerning alternative ways of satisfying the Graduate School foreign language requirement is available in the Graduate School.

GRADUATE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Consult the Graduate Bulletin and your major department for additional information concerning requirements for advanced degrees. All regular degree and provisional degree graduate students must have the approval of their authorized departmental representatives concerning their proposed program of courses for each semester and must plan their degree programs with their designated advisers. Admission to the Graduate School is not equivalent to approval of candidacy for an advanced degree. A student who wishes to become a candidate for a degree must make application at the time in the manner prescribed under the requirements for the degree sought.

SCHEDULE OF GRADUATE COURSES

Time and place listings of graduate courses are given in normal numerical sequence under the related undergraduate department and college or school. For example, Anthropology-College of Arts and Sciences; Electrical Engineering-College of Engineering and Applied Science; Music-College of Music.

INFORMATION FOR MASTER'S DEGREE CANDIDATES

Graduate students who are writing a master's thesis must complete a minimum of 4 semester hours and a maximum of 6 semester hours for thesis; the student may register for the 1-6 hours in any term or terms of residence, but the total number of hours must equal the number of credit hours he expects to receive for his thesis. The final grade for the thesis will be determined when the thesis is completed. If it is not completed by the end of the term in which the student is registered for it, an "In Progress" should be reported. Candidates for the M.Ed. degree receive a total of 2 semester hours for the M.Ed. report.

The rules of the Graduate School require that students be registered at the time they take their comprehensive final examination for the master's degree. If all course-work has been completed and if the students have previously registered for the total thesis hours or report, they must register "Candidate for Degree." To register "Candidate for Degree," an Independent Study/Thesis Approval Form must be completed using the regular department number, 999 as the course number, and 900 as the section number. This form must be deposited with the other registration materials.

INFORMATION FOR DOCTORAL DEGREE CANDIDATES

Doctoral candidates must be registered for doctoral thesis in order to take the doctoral final examination in defense of the thesis. Registration must be completed at the registration period which precedes each semester or summer term. Students must complete an Independent Study/Thesis Approval Form and deposit it with the other registration materials.

A student certified as a candidate for the Ph.D., D.Mu.A., Ed.D., or D.B.A. degree must enroll and pay tuition for spring and fall semester of each year until he either attains the degree or formally resigns as a candidate. This continuing registration is independent of whether or not the candidate is in residence at the University.

A student must be registered at the time he takes the comprehensive examination for the Ph.D. Registration must be completed at the regular registration period which precedes each semester or summer term.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Advising: All pre-journalism majors as well as students admitted to the school as majors are required to consult a journalism adviser each registration period. Lower-division pre-journalism students in the College of Arts and Sciences should use major code number 141. Change of major can be accomplished only with a Change of Major form available in the dean's office. Pre-journalism majors should complete by the end of the sophomore year Jour. 100 and Jour. 250 and the following lower-division requirements of the College of Arts and Sciences:

- Humanities two 2-semester courses
- Natural Science. two 2-semester courses
- Social Science two 2-semester courses

Other requirements for transfer to the School of Journalism are a minimum of 60 semester credit hours with a minimum grade point average of 2.25 overall and at least 2.5 in all journalism courses attempted.

Administrative Drops: Students may be dropped from journalism courses for nonattendance, especially during the first week of classes, or for not having completed prerequisites.

Requirements for graduation: For the Bachelor Science in journalism, students must earn at least 28 hours in journalism. Not more than 34 semester hours in journalism may be counted in the minimum of 124 hours required for graduation.

Grade averages of not less than 2.25 overall and 2.50 in journalism courses are required for graduation. These same averages must be maintained to remain in the school.

All journalism majors are required to complete the following upper division courses:

- Jour. 377-3 History of Journalism
- Jour. 490-3 Journalism and Public Opinion

In addition the student must complete the major sequence requirements and electives to bring total journalism hours to a minimum of 28. Consult the current UCB Catalog or a journalism adviser for sequence requirements.

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COURSE OF STUDY

The normal academic load is 16 to 18 hours. Permission to take more than 18 hours or less than 12 hours may be granted only by the dean. A student must be registered for at least 12 hours of credit on the Boulder campus in order to qualify for a semester of residency. The proper sequence of both the professional and nonprofessional courses in the curriculum must be maintained. A student under the status of scholastic probation will not be permitted to advance into either the fourth or fifth year of the course of study sequence until at least a cumulative 2.00 grade point average has been attained in the School of Pharmacy. A grade of D is not an acceptable passing grade in a professional course and a student will not be permitted to register for fifth year professional courses unless all third and fourth year professional courses have been completed satisfactorily with a grade of C or better. A student may not register for any third or fourth year professional courses unless all prerequisites have been satisfied with an acceptable passing grade.

PASS/FAIL OPTION

The Pass/Fail option is not permitted for the non-professional or professional courses that are required for graduation. After enrollment in the School of Pharmacy, a maximum of six semester hours of nonprofessional electives may be taken to apply towards the degree under the Pass/Fail option.

WITHDRAWAL

A student leaving the University during a semester or term must report to the School of Pharmacy office to initiate a statement of withdrawal. If a student leaves without obtaining an official approval of withdrawal, a grade of failure will be reported for each enrolled course.

ACADEMIC STANDARDS

In the School of Pharmacy a grade of D is not an acceptable passing grade in a professional course; if a grade of D is received, the course must be repeated until a grade of C or better is received. Professional courses are those listed under Pharmacy-Pharmaceutics, Clinical Pharmacy, Pharmacy Administration, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology, and Biopharmacy. A student must maintain a cumulative 2.00 grade point average for all courses attempted in the School of Pharmacy to remain in good standing. If the average falls below 2.00, a student will be placed on scholastic probation with a mandatory reduction of academic load and extracurricular activities. The scholastic record must be improved each subsequent semester, and if a 2.00 average is not attained or satisfactory improvement demonstrated after two semesters, the status of probation will be changed to suspension.

PHARMACY RESIDENCY

The American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy requires that a minimum residency of three academic years shall be required to complete the professional years of study for a baccalaureate degree in pharmacy. To qualify for a semester of pharmacy residency, a student must be registered for a least 12 hours of credit in the School of Pharmacy on the Boulder campus. If a student takes a reduced schedule of less than 12 hours for the semester or attends the summer session, pharmacy residency will be granted in proportion to the number of hours completed and the duration of the term. Pharmacy residency will not be granted for enrollment at other campuses or through the Division of Continuing Education of the University.

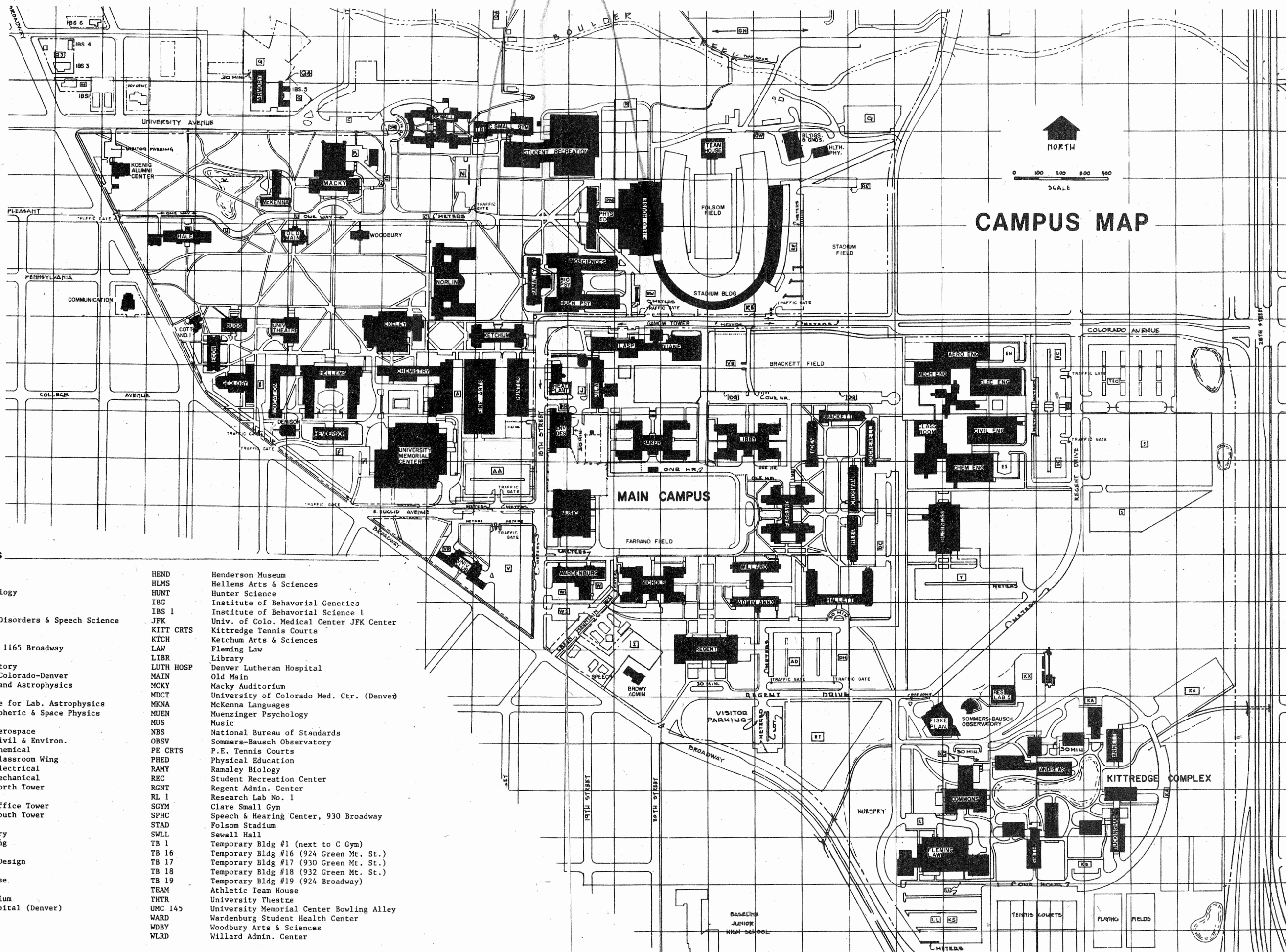

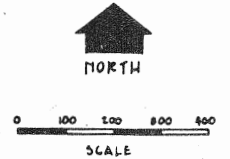
